Tectonic, sonic power

not the case in many of the world's poorest places. You and I can turn on a tap and have clean, fresh water flow into our homes - a simple act we can enjoy here in New Zealand. Yet nearly two billion people worldwide still lack this basic necessity. Many are forced to drink water contaminated with human waste, exposing them to serious health risks.
